2016 Student Achievement Targets

Each year the school identifies student achievement areas for development. Last year we identified weaknesses in the following areas:

Mathematics

Target: The group of Yr 6 students 'Below' and 'Well Below' the Mathematics National Standard in 2015, will be achieving 'At' or 'Above' the National Standard by the end of Term 4 2016.

Overall Teacher Judgements (OTJs) based on National Standards

62.5% moved from 'Below' to 'At' the National Standard

12.5% stayed at 'Below'

25% stayed at 'Well Below'

Writing

Target: The group of 7 students 'Below' the Writing National Standard at 80 weeks in 2015 will be achieving 'At' or 'Above' the 120 weeks National Standard/Interim Standard by the end of Term 4 2016.

OTJs based on National Standards

76% (6) working 'Below'

14% (1) working 'Well Below'

e-asTTle writing results

44% (3) Moved up in all 7 domains

28% (2) Moved up in 3 domains

28% (2) Did not complete writing test in Term 1

Even though the results are not what we were anticipating it was encouraging to see that all children who participated in the e-asTTle writing test in Terms 1 and 4, scored higher in the domains in Term 4. It is highly likely that without this intervention some of these children may have moved from 'Below' to 'Well Below' in the OTJs at the end of 120 weeks at school.
