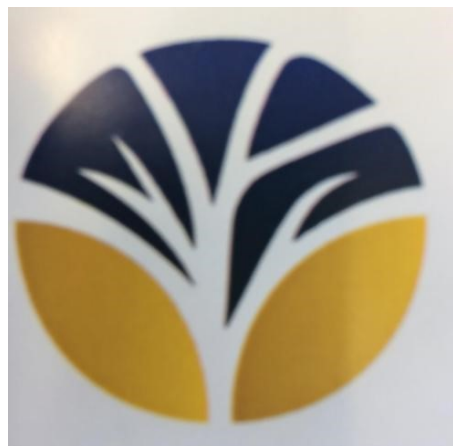
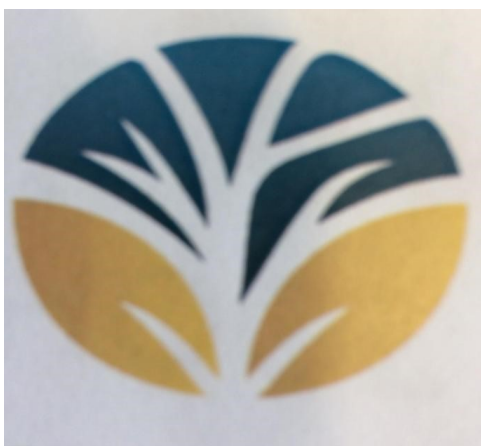
Finally they will be sharing it with our community.
