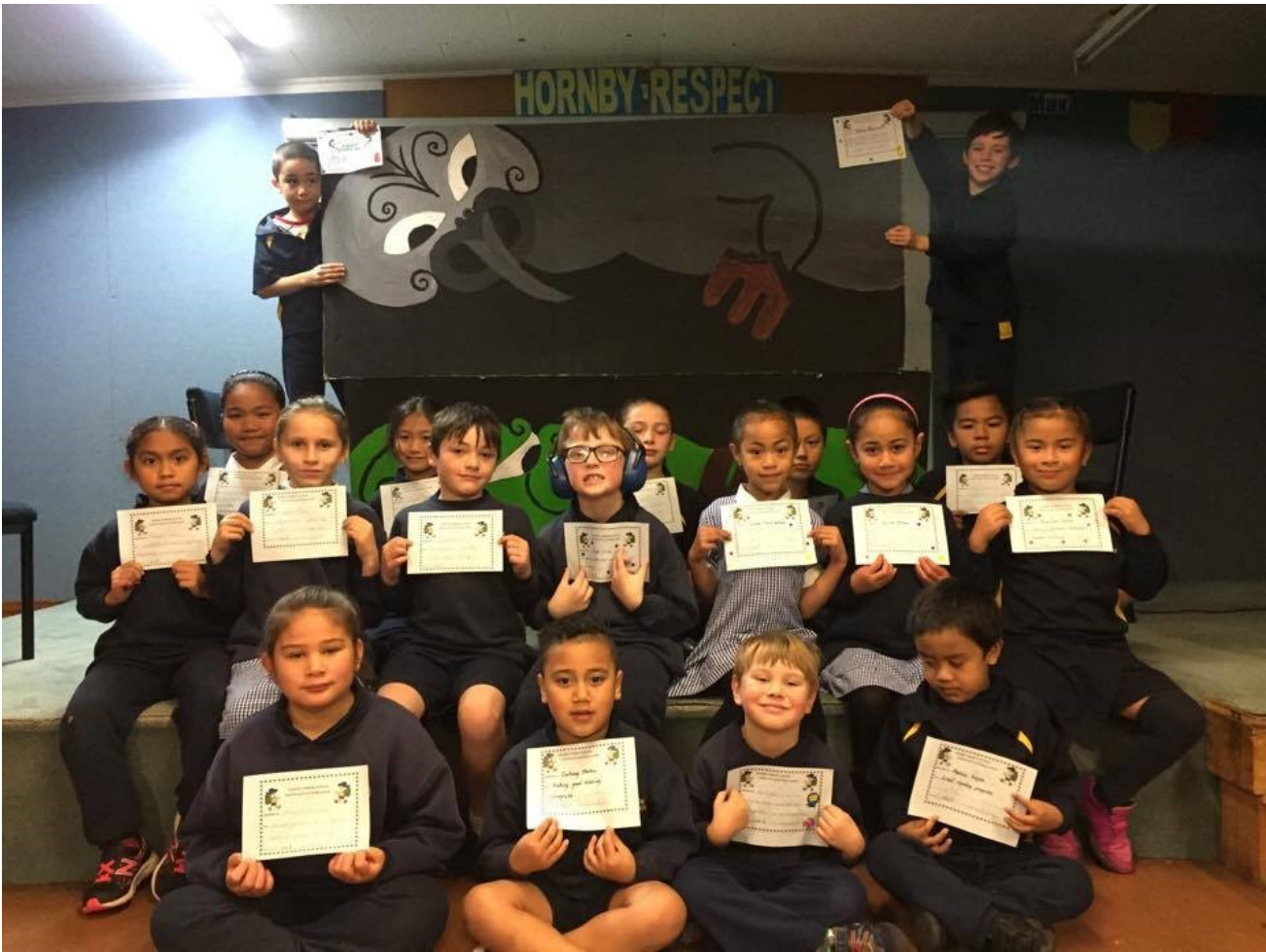


Ruma 3
