Cybersafe Workshop

Last week children and staff were fortunate to participate in John Parsons workshops on how to keep safe online and hear his very important messages. Do you know what your child is doing online? What sites are they visiting and who are they communicating with? Does your child have a Facebook account? *"Facebook requires everyone to be at least 13 years old before they can create an account (in some jurisdictions, this age limit may be higher). Creating an account with false info is a violation of our terms. This includes accounts registered on the behalf of someone under 13."* (www.facebook.com)

The evening workshop at the HWMC provided many invaluable messages for parents. Here are some of them

- keep open lines of communication with your child
- use your normal parenting values, be involved
- non judgmental – if children make a mistake online, talk about it with them and use it as a learning experience
- 'nagging' parents are loving parents. Restrict when your child can use their device.
- if you would not allow your child to do something illegal offline, do not allow them to do something illegal online, eg. set up a Facebook account
